STAGES FOR RE-OPENING OF CITY FACILITIES

Goal: To minimize the impact of the COVID-19 virus to the citizens of Greenville, while still delivering quality customer service.

Stage 1 - May 18:

- City offices open, public only allowed in designated areas
- Public and staff meetings held in person with social distancing
- Library open with limited public access and social distancing required
- City programming limited to virtual (parks and recreation, library, etc.)
- Golf course, open space parks and trails remain open with guidelines being followed
- Reecy Davis Recreation Center open at 25% capacity
- Municipal Auditorium open with occupancy limits and social distancing guidelines in place
- Civic Center open with occupancy limits and social distancing guidelines in place
- Airport terminal open limiting building to 25% capacity

Stage 2 - June 1:

- City offices open, public only allowed in designated areas
- Public and staff meetings held in person with social distancing
- Library open and social distancing required
- City programming limited to virtual (parks and recreation, library, etc.)
- Golf course, open space parks and trails remain open with social distancing guidelines
- Reecy Davis Recreation Center open at 50% capacity
- Municipal Auditorium open and social distancing guidelines in place
- Civic Center open and social distancing guidelines in place
- Airport terminal open limiting building to 25% capacity

July 1:

- Bottle Rocket Bash (entertainment, food vendors, and fireworks only)

PUBLIC WORKS: Streets: This week, crews: completed concrete work at Villa Fontana and street right-of-way; shredded Reservoir #5; performed tree removal at Sale and Eastland; ran the street sweeper; and demolished a substandard house at 3210 Crocket Street. **Traffic:** Crews worked on the Traffic Control Plan (TCP) for the 2020 Street Improvement Project (SIP); and worked on repairing miscellaneous equipment at the Service Center.

Engineering Division: Stonewood Addition: Crews are tying in water lines and sewer lines. (Pic. #1)
Jackson Run Phase II and Cottonwood Phase II: Punch list items are being finalized.
Stonewall Addition: Franchise utility designs are awaiting approval. **Lake Tawakoni Pad Site:** Pad has been constructed and the transformers have been set. (Pic. #2)



Water Distribution: Crews replaced 230 ft. of 10 in. main and installed new services on Lee, between Stonewall and Johnson; and are prepping the road and ditch for resurfacing. **Wastewater**

Collections: Crews replaced roughly 460 ft. of 6 in. main and two manholes; and installed water and sewer services.

Utility Construction Crew: Morse Street Water Line: Installation is complete, and has been prepped for resurfacing. Planning for the next project has begun.

The Farmers' Market will be open Saturday from 9:00 a.m.-Noon. Social distancing is required. **Expected products are:** yellow squash, zucchini, tomatoes, red potatoes, beets, onions, lettuce, kale, Swiss chard, and microgreens.

Other items are: pork, honey, eggs, soaps, breads, and baked goods.

MAIN STREET: Downtown restaurants open with limited seating and takeout are: **Mac's American Grill, Pizzo's, The Texan, Ashen Rose, The Empty Glass Saloon, La Catrina Street Tacos and Johnson Street Smokehouse.**

GREENVILLE MUNICIPAL AUDITORIUM (GMA): The GMA officially reopens in June with limited capacity (25% or 350 people). Social distancing guidelines and increased cleaning standards are in place. When attending an event at the GMA, we ask that you please observe social distancing and know that every other row will be blocked off. When selecting a place to sit, we ask that you maintain two empty seats between groups or parties sitting together.

CONVENTION AND VISITORS BUREAU (CVB): This week, we released a new video that shares the message "**Greenville is Open for Business and Fun**". The goal is to inform residents and tourists about what is open and what they can do if they want to get out. The video covers Downtown Public Art, Audie Murphy American Cotton Museum, Greenville Hotels, Retail, Dining, Farmers Market, Entertainment, Library, and Parks.
