Utility Construction Crew: Crews completed a new main tie-in on Morris Street; and will begin cleaning up next week.

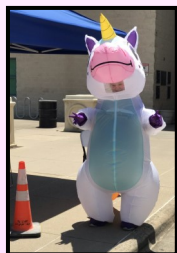
