NEWS OF THE WEEK

January 8, 2021

Upcoming filing dates for candidates to apply for City Council/Mayor places are as follows:

First Day to file application for place on the ballot – January 13, 2021

Last Day to file – February 12, 2021 by 5:00 p.m.

Places up for election this year are: Place 5, Place 6, and Mayor - Place 7.

These are (3) year terms for each and residents must reside in the District for which they are running.

PUBLIC WORKS: Engineering: Industrial Drive: The contractor has completed 95% of all storm line installation, and is conducting lime series for roadway subgrade preparations. **Cottonwood Phase III:** The contractor has established and completed all roadway elevations. **Wellington Estates:** The developer has started working on punch list items for final inspection. **Stonewall Street:** The contractor has placed all concrete pavement to Woodrow, and Poplar to Webb is open in both directions. Contractor will complete all water lines to Hwy. 69 and Stonewall, sewer lines are completed to Woodrow. The contractor is still removing concrete and debris so be aware of possible traffic congestion. **Jacksons Run Phase II:** Is preparing for final inspection. **Ed Rutherford:** The sewer main is 95% complete and the water lines are completed. Contractor is starting concrete preparations and placing concrete next week. **Stonewood Phase II:** The lime stabilization subgrade is complete. Trimming final evaluations of subgrade with concrete to follow.

Water Distribution: Repaired leaks at 2401 Beecha and 5608 New Haven; repaired valve at Walnut at Polk, and a Fire Hydrant repair at 3004 I-30 Service Road. They are also assisting Wastewater Collections on the Carol Street sewer replacement project.

Wastewater Collections: Crews started on replacement of the sewer main on Carol Street.

Utility Construction Crew: Crews have continued working on the new water main installation for the Spencer Street Water & Sewer Project.

Streets Division: Crews have worked on street cut repairs at 2106 Walnut; completed storm drain repairs at 3101 St. John; and finished saw cut asphalt repairs at 2616 Crocket.

Traffic: Crews have set up and installed new equipment at 701 Clark.

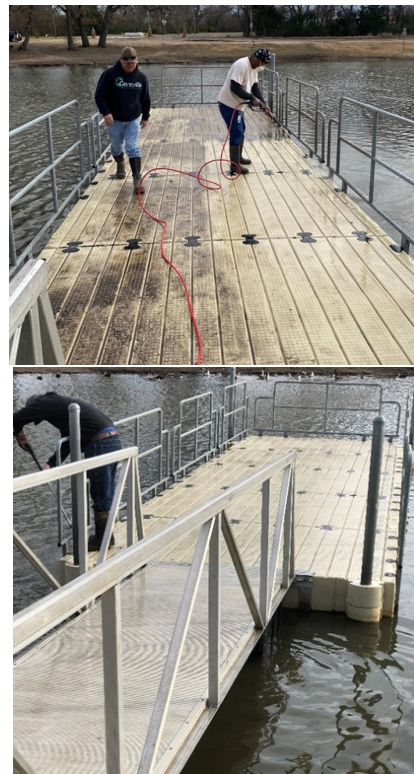
Tickets are \$35 - \$50 and are available at ShowtimeAtTheGMA.com.
