Public Works

Wastewater Collections Division: Crews have been working to replace a sewer main located at King and Hemphill. Crews also replaced a sewer mainline at 3300 King Street.

Engineering Division:

Roy Warren - The contractor has continued to work on this project and is 95% completed. The contractor will open this project on March 14 for full traffic.

Sayle Street - The contractor is currently placing 200 yards of roadway continuing to Meadowbrook Lane. The intersection of Ridgecrest will start the water connection on the week of March 14.

Stanford Street - The contractor has continued to place sanitary sewer and storm pipe from Sayle to Roberts.

Delano Estates - The contractor has completed the remix procedure for lime subgrade for roadways within this project and has estimated to start the concrete placement on March 9.

Carol Drive - All asphalt has been placed to date. The contractor is currently replacing driveways and completing the storm lines on this project. The estimated completion date is April 6, depending on the weather.

Traders Road - The contractor has placed 150 yards of roadway a day this week and continued to remove the identified areas of the roadway during this activity.

Water Distribution Division: Crews worked on a new water valve installation at the 2500 block of Jordan and Johnson Street (Pic. 3). Crews also replaced a water valve at Stonewall and Jordan Street.

Streets Division: Street crews are patching potholes in numerous areas this week.

Drainage Division: Crews continued to pick up brush and work on-site for brush piles.

Traffic Division: The Traffic Division is replacing damaged street signs in several areas throughout the City.

A contractor has started construction on a waterline for the private development at the intersection of FM 1570 and Highway 34. The project limits will be from this intersection to Coyote crossing.
