

## Greenville Fire-Rescue (GFR)

This week, GFR hosted training for a new program designed to assist older adult drivers in our community. CarFit is a community-based educational program that promotes continued safe driving and mobility among older drivers by focusing attention on safety, comfort, and fit. CarFit was created in 2006 in collaboration with AAA (American Automobile Association), AARP, and the American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA). The program is designed to help older drivers find out how well they currently fit their vehicle, highlight actions they can take to improve their fit and to promote conversations about driver safety and community mobility. A proper fit in one's vehicle can greatly increase not only the driver's safety but also the safety of others. In March of 2020, GFR had the distinction of being the very last CarFit training in the country being held days before the nationwide Covid shut-down. Almost two years to the day later, GFR once again held the distinction of holding the very first IN-PERSON CarFit training in the country! We are happy to be able to provide another service that will allow our seniors to continue living independently and safer in their homes and on the roads!

GFR currently has crews deployed to the Eastland County Complex wild land fires (Pic. 1). These fires have destroyed more than 54,000 acres and killed a deputy. Crews worked with other firefighters from across the North Texas area providing support to already thin resources. The fires are nearing complete containment, at this time.

## Public Works

**Wastewater Collections Division:** Crews installed a city side cleanout on the 4300 block of Lee Street. Crews did an emergency repair and replaced a collapsed sewer main on the 4500 block of Cordell.

### Engineering Division:

**Stanford Street** - The contractor is continuing to place sanitary sewer and storm pipe from Sayle to Roberts.  
**Sayle Street** - The contractor started on the water connection at the Ridgecrest intersection for this project.  
**Delano Estates** - The contractor started the concrete placement for this project.  
**Carol Drive** - Currently, the contractor is replacing driveways and completing storm lines for this project, and all asphalt has been placed to date. The estimated completion date is April 6, dependent on the weather.  
**Traders Road** - The contractor placed 150 yards of roadway a day this week and continued to remove the identified problem areas of the road during this activity.

**Water Distribution Division:** Crews worked on a service install at the intersection of Tipps and Utah. They also worked on the replacement of the fire hydrant at the fire station located on Leo Hackney.

**Streets Division:** Street crews are patching potholes in numerous areas this week and mowing ditches on the southern part of the City from I-30 to Traders Road and from Wesley to Joe Ramsey.

**Traffic Division:** Crews have worked on fabrication of new street signs for the new subdivisions.

The April History Spotlight on the library Facebook will be available to view on April 4. It will feature the history of the library movement in Greenville and the Carnegie Library, the first library building!

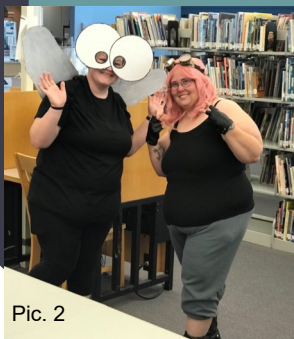
