Greenville Fire-Rescue (GFR)

As we head into severe weather season, GFR recommends signing up for some type of severe weather notification app. Like smoke alarms, early notifications are one of the best ways to help keep your family safe. Signing up for CodeRED is a must, whether you work or live in the city. Those working here but living elsewhere will benefit from having notifications while on the clock. (When signing up, you may enter your facility's address.) For those that live here, just use your home address. Sign up here: <https://www.ci.greenville.tx.us/299/CodeRED>.

Additionally, it's best to have more than one app for notifications should one be down for some reason. Besides the wide variety of weather apps, the following news stations have apps that provide notifications: WFAA: WFAA-News from North Texas, FOX 4 Dallas-FTW: Weather (Fox4WAPP), NBCDFW: NBC 5 Dallas-Fort Worth, CBSDFW - CBSDFW Weather, and KETK (Tyler): East Texas Storm Team.

Public Works

Wastewater Collections Division: Crews flushed lines on the 2400 block of Beecha Street, ran the camera on the 1400 block of Jacksons Run, and repaired a city side cleanout on the 7400 block of Carol Drive.

Engineering Division:

Stanford Street Phase One - The contractor has completed all wet utilities and is in the progress of subgrade preparation for the roadway.

Stanford Street Phase Two - The contractor has started to place the waterline from Moulton to Gee Street. The Traffic Control Plan (TCP) will be set from Stonewall to Moulton at the beginning of next week.

Spencer Street - The contractor started to move equipment on-site and will begin milling operations on Monday, April 4.

Delano Estates - The contractor is placing concrete streets this week. The contractor will replace and repair the section on Oliver next week due to rain this week.

Carol Drive - The contractor finished the roadway and storm line installations. They will continue to clean and replace driveway sections on the south side of this project.

Traders Road - The contractor is continuing to replace concrete panels on the roadway. This work will continue with the eastbound lane for the next three weeks. The westbound lane will start after the eastbound lane is complete.

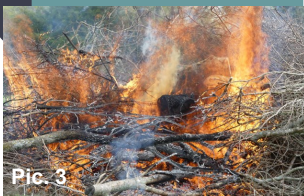
Water Distribution Division: Crews worked on a service line leak located on the 10400 block of Wesley Street, completed a valve replacement on King Street and Horsley Street, and installed a water tap at the 4300 block of Pickett Street.

Streets Division: Street crews have removed rock piles from the airport, completed the burn pile from winter storm debris (Pic. 3), completed the Rees Street demo for substandard, and completed several pothole repairs in various locations.

Traffic Division: Crews have added four new street signs on Carol Drive and replaced five stop signs at different locations in the city. Crews have also started working on chevrons in several locations.

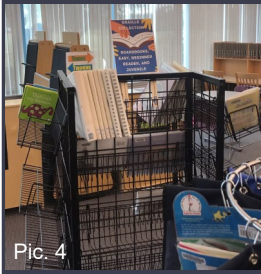
