GFR just placed the new Battalion 1 into service this past week (Pic. 2). The new Ford is outfitted with updated equipment, including a slide-out rack in the rear to provide improved command on large-scale incidents for our battalion chiefs.

Public Works

Wastewater Collections Division: Crews repaired a fire hydrant at the intersection of Horton Street and Templeton Street and worked to repair a water leak on the 2500 block of Lee Street.

Engineering Division:

Stanford Street Phase One - The contractor completed all wet utilities and subgrade prep and is ready to pour concrete for the roadway.

Stanford Street Phase Two - The Traffic Control Plan has been set from Stonewall to Moulton, and the contractor continues to place the waterline from Moulton to Gee Street.

Spencer Street - The contractor started milling operations.

Delano Estates - The contractor is placing concrete and repairing the section of Oliver this week.

Carol Drive - The contractor continues to clean and replace driveway sections on the south side of this project.

Traders Road - The contractor is continuing to replace concrete panels on the roadway. The Traffic Control Plan will have the eastbound lane open and the westbound lane closed to begin work.

Water Distribution Division: Crews worked to repair a sewer main on the 900 block of Clark Street and worked on a repair of a city-side clean-out on the 2100 block of Division.

Streets Division: One crew has been out mowing right-of-ways, ditches, and drainage easements. The other crew is in the process of repairing potholes and utility cuts on various streets in the City.

Traffic Division: Crews are still working on chevrons in several locations. They also replaced street signs that were knocked over by vehicular accidents.
