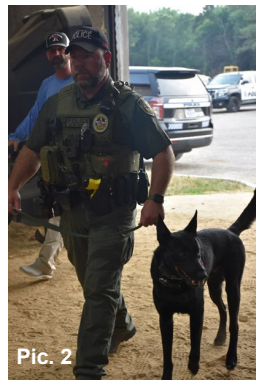


Hanging with Heroes

Public Works

Wastewater Collections Division: Crews installed a city-side cleanout on the 1400 block of Skyline. Crews also traced (placed a camera in the pipes and looked for damaged ones) the 1400 block of Alpine and installed sewer service lines.

Engineering Division:

Stanford Street Phase One - The contractor is placing concrete from Roberts to Wesley.

Stanford Street Phase Two - The contractor has finished all water tie-ins, and all residences are now on the new water line. The contractor is starting the second phase of utility work.

Traders Road - The contractor is in the clean-up phase, and a walk-through will be scheduled next week for punch list items to be addressed.

Spencer Street - The contractor is continuing to prep subgrade for cement treatment.

Delano Estates Phase One - The contractor is still placing concrete paving and curb inlets from Highway 69 into the facility.

Washington Street Sewer - The contractor is still working on placing sewer lines.

Water Distribution Division: Crews worked to repair a water main break on the 2200 block of Wellington Street and repaired a fire hydrant located on the 3500 block of Henderson Street at O'Neal Street.

Streets Division: Street crews are mowing the city right-of-ways, ditch cleaning, and pothole patching.

Traffic Division: Crews are in the process of setting up Traffic Control Plans for projects.
