

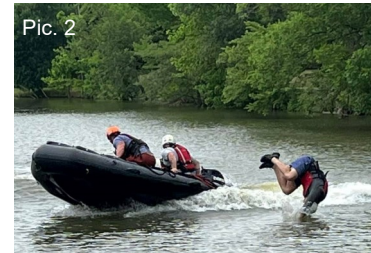
## Greenville Police Department

## Public Works

**Wastewater Collections Division:** Crews continued to repair a collapsed sewer main on Division Street.

### Engineering Division:

**Stanford Street Phase One** - The contractor is currently sealing construction joints within the roadway.  
**Stanford Street Phase Two** - The contractor finished all water tie in's and will start the sewer line installment next week.

**Spencer Street** - The contractor is continuing to prep subgrade for cement treatment.

**Washington Street Sewer** - The contractor is 80% complete with placing sewer lines.

**Traders Road** - The contractor is addressing punch list items to finalize this project.

**Pickett Street Water** - The contractor has begun work starting at the Pickett and Rainey intersection.

**Lafayette Area** - The contractor is milling and overlaying the streets in this area.

**Sayle Street** - The contractor has both lanes of traffic open. Crews are finishing the last portions of Sayle Street before a walkthrough is done.

**Water Distribution Division:** Crews worked to repair a water leak at the 4500 block of 4th Street and repaired a service leak at the 1900 block of Fuller.

**Streets/Traffic Divisions:** Crews are working on mowing drainage ditches, setting up Traffic Control on various streets under construction, and repairing potholes at various locations throughout the city.

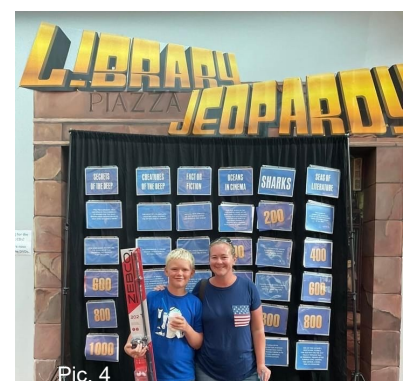
