Wastewater Collections Division: Crews finished repairs to a collapsed sewer main on Division Street. .

Engineering Division:

Stanford Street Phase I - The contractor is installing the sidewalk approaches.

Stanford Street Phase II - The contractor is starting with the sewer line installment.

Traders Road - The contractor is addressing punch list items to finalize this project.

Spencer Street - The contractor is asphalt paving all week.

Washington Street Sewer - The contractor is 90% completed with placing the sewer lines and has reached the Carver intersection.

Pickett and Langford Water - The contractor began installing the new water line.

Lafayette Area - The contractor is finalizing mill and overlaying for this area.

Sayle Street - The contractor is reconstructing the intersection of Sayle and Eastland.
