

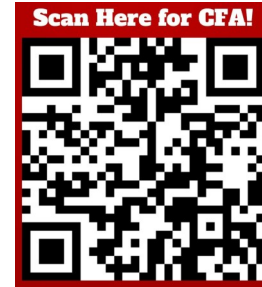
## Greenville Police Department

## Greenville Fire-Rescue

GFR is taking applications for our tenth annual Citizen's Fire Academy, which is set to kick off Thursday, September 8. The class meets once a week for 12 weeks and is designed to provide insight into your fire department and the how and why it operates the way it does. Students will get an in-depth and hands-on view of the world of firefighting. The class is part classroom, part hands-on with a different topic each week, a Saturday Play Day where you play with various pieces of equipment (like the Jaws of Life), and concludes with graduation. All activities are voluntary, so if you would rather observe, that's fine too! This class does not certify participants to be firefighters. ## Public Works

**Wastewater Collections Division:** Wastewater Collection is waiting to hear back on the bacteriological test results from testing on Cedar Street. Crews are also 90% complete on the Cedar Street Project.

### Engineering Division:

**Stanford Street West** - The paving from Wesley to Stonewall is almost completed. The sanitary sewer from Bois D'Arc is still being worked on.

**Stanford Street East** - The contractor is working on Punch list items. This project should be 100% completed within the next couple of weeks.

**Washington Street** - The contractor continues to lay asphalt and replace curbs, gutters, and driveways.

**Pickett Street Water** - The contractor has connected the new water mains. The contractor completed pressure testing, and paving will begin next week in the area.

**Walnut Street** - The contractor is 90% complete on laying water lines for the water mains. The pressure testing is almost complete. The sanitary sewer will begin within the next two weeks.

**Water Distribution Division:** Crews worked on water main breaks this week at St. John at Polk and on Jeanette Avenue at Wilton Drive. Crews also worked a water leak at 3403 Wesley Street (Pic. 2).

**Streets/Drainage Divisions:** Crews are finalizing the work done on the Town Branch drainage project. The rip rap stones have been placed in the channel.

**Traffic Divisions:** Crews have replaced signs that were damaged due to accidents within the city.

**Utility Construction Division:** Crews are waiting on Templeton Street and Texas to be paved before starting back up on the water line installation. Crews are over 75% complete with the new water line installation.
