Greenville Fire-Rescue (GFR)

GFR responded to a mutual aid call to the City of Fate on a large-scale fire early in the morning on August 30. Multiple agencies responded to assist Fate and help bring the fire under control, preventing its spread to nearby exposures, including occupied homes. Public Works

Wastewater Collections Division: Crews should be completing Cedar Street's water main installation this week, and all water services should now be switched over.

Engineering Division:

Stanford Street - The contractor is waiting on Atmos to relocate gas lines so they can continue to replace the storm sewer on the east section. Paving continues on Stanford's west side from Johnson to Stonewall.

Washington Street - Paving is moving east, and the contractor is currently on College Street headed east to Wellington. The contractor has replaced all utilities and is also replacing curbs and driveways.

Walnut Street - The contractor has finished the milling operations and is working on the water tie-ins and marking locations for the sanitary sewer connections. The replacement of sanitary sewer lines on the southern portion of this project will start soon.

Water Distribution Division: Crews continue to repair water breaks at the 1100 block of Pecan, the 600 block of Deer Drive, and the 1800 block of College Street.

Streets/Drainage Division: Crews are working on repairing potholes and dressing dirt roads (they are blading the dirt roads to make them smooth after ruts were made).

Traffic Division: Crews are installing "No Parking" signs in various areas of the city.

Utility Construction Division: Crews have restarted their work laying the new water lines on Templeton Street and should be complete with installation this week.

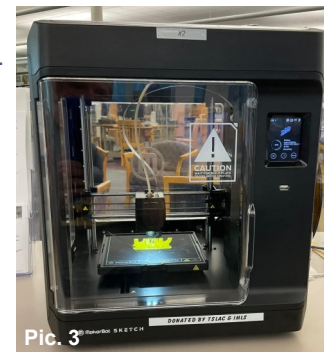
W. Walworth Harrison Public Library
