## Public Works

### Engineering Division:

**Stanford Street:** The contractor continued to place concrete paving from Moulton to Pine Street. Atmos Energy is on-site relocating gas mains from Pine to Houston Street.

**Washington Street:** The contractor has begun curb and gutter work along Williams Street including intersections. The removal of the old curb from Langford to College has begun.

**Walnut Street:** The contractor continues to tie existing water mains with the new 12" water main placed for the project. Sewer line placement has begun at Lee Street. Road elevations are being staked, and small cut areas for subgrade are underway.

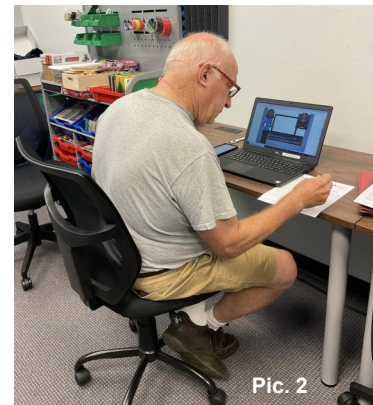
**Roy Warren Parkway:** The contractor has begun survey staking the project location and is setting control points throughout the project.

**Streets Division:** Crews have patched several potholes this week, including Lee Street at Houston, Eastland, King, Texas, and Cleveland. They have also replaced storm inlets at Bourland and Sayle. Crews began working on Albowich and Mason Drive for roadway surface, with Ridgecrest to be started next week. The roadway miles of street sweeping have totaled 20 miles this week.

**Traffic Division:** Crews have assisted the Sewer Department in removing pumps from lift stations and replaced three signs this week.
