## Public Works

**Wastewater Collections Division:** Crews worked on repairing city-side clean-outs in the 1400 block of Reiger Street and the 2400 block of Fannie Street. Crews also repaired a manhole at the intersection of Sayle Street and Pace Street.

### Engineering Division:

**Stanford Street:** The contractor continued to place concrete paving sections in the Pine Street area and has sealed all expansion joints and cut joints in the expansion for this project. The storm sewer installation continued from Houston Street, and Atmos Energy is expected to arrive on-site to relocate gas lines that conflict with this project.

**Washington Street:** The contractor is placing the curb and gutter but also removing the existing curb and gutter along Langford Street.

**Walnut Street:** The contractor started installing the sanitary sewer lines from Lee Street and continues north. The water connections are still underway for the few remaining line and expecting Franchise utilities to relocate existing utilities that conflict.

**Water Distribution Division:** Crews repaired water leaks in the 1400 block of Alpine Drive and the 1200 block of Cleveland Street.

**Streets Division:** The crews patched potholes in the Walworth area and demolished a house on Washington Street. We are still grading the gravel roads within the city and placing extra material to reshape the roadways. Crews mowed the Aerobic and Cedar Creek areas with a boom mower and started cleaning culverts and intersections along 7th Street.

**Utility Construction Division:** Crews installed a new 8' water main in the 3800 block of Bourland Street.
