## Greenville Fire-Rescue

GFR continues to be busy with Fire Prevention month activities alongside other events and training. Saturday, the Citizen's Fire Academy (CFA) class had Playday. This part of the class is where they get to do hands-on activities that firefighters do daily. The day began at AIM Recycling (formerly New Phoenix Metals) to learn about extrication skills. They got to cut up cars using the Jaws of Life (Pic. 2), cut windshields, and 'pop' tires; all are skills needed to make a car wreck scene safer. The day continued back at Station #3 with a hose challenge where they sprayed water at a target, a ride on Ladder 3, fire extinguisher training, door breaching, and search and rescue in full bunker gear! The class did great, and they gained a deeper appreciation for the training needed to keep our city safe.

We had a busy rest of the week! We had "Show and Tells" at Stepping Stones Daycare, Brookland Learning Center, and Lamar Elementary, station tours for a home school co-op and scout troop, and storytime at the library. The CFA had its class on Investigations. We sold Breast Cancer awareness shirts in support of Bras for the Cause. GFR will be providing a safety program for the Daughters of the American Revolution group, where they graciously donate staples to all four fire stations for their daily meals. Lastly, we will be doing a PR event at Barrett Motors and hand out Fire Prevention month materials.
