**Water Distribution:** Crews worked on a water break in the 7100 block of Shelby Avenue and repaired a fire hydrant on the 3200 block of Crockett Street (Pic. 3).

**Stanford Street:** The contractor is working with GEUS and Atmos Energy for the relocation of franchise utilities for the new roadway section.

**Walnut Street:** The contractor is placing storm pipes and sanitary sewers for this project. The intersection of Walnut and Lee is set to be poured in the next two weeks.

**Roy Warren Roadway Project:** The contractor is moving fences and gates in preparation for dirt work operations to begin.

**Roy Warren Sewer Project:** The contractor mobilized to the site and began pothole operation for verification of utilities and depth.

**Wastewater Collections:** Crews are working on water and sewer taps on the 1300 block of Hemphill Street (Pic. 4). They are also working on using a camera to view the main sewer line on Clearview Road.

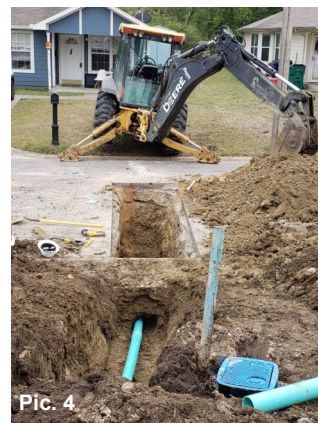
