Greenville Police Department

Greenville Fire-Rescue

GFR participated in the Veterans Day Parade and the Fly-In at Majors Field this past weekend. It is always truly an honor to pay respect to our veterans. GFR also conducted 'real life' search and rescue training with a house donated by the Wildcatter group. The house is set for demolition at the end of the year, and they have graciously allowed our crews to utilize it for training on fire ground operations. We held Week 9 of the Citizen's Fire Academy with Sylvia Peace presenting on Community Risk Reduction.

Public Works

Wastewater Collections Division: Crews installed sewer stops on the 1900 block of Utilis and the 5100 block of Lee. They also flushed a sewer main at the intersection of Bourland Street and Morgan Streets.

Engineering Division:

Walnut Street: The contractor is placing storm pipe and sanitary sewer for this project. The intersection of Walnut and Lee is set to be poured in the next two weeks.

Stanford Street: The contractor is working with GEUS and Atmos Energy for the relocation of franchise utilities for the new roadway section.

Roy Warren Roadway: The contractor is moving fences and gates in preparation for dirt work operations to begin, and has started the earthwork operation at the drainage channel north of the GEUS substation.

Roy Warren Sewer: The contractor mobilized to site and has begun pothole operation for verification of utilities and depths.

Water Distribution Division: Crews worked on repairing a leaking water valve on Lee and Utilis Street. They also worked on a water leak on the 2900 block of Texas Street and on Bois D'Arc and Frazier Street.

Utility Construction: Crews completed the third section of the new water main line installation on Gordon Street and will move on to the final section next week (Pic. 1).

Streets Division: Crews continue with pothole repairs and reshaping dirt roads with asphalt milling for stability and base repair.

Traffic Division: Crews continue to make new street name blades for new subdivisions, with a total of twelve signs made and set this week.

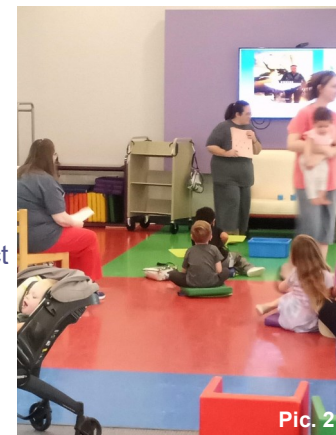
W. Walworth Harrison Public Library

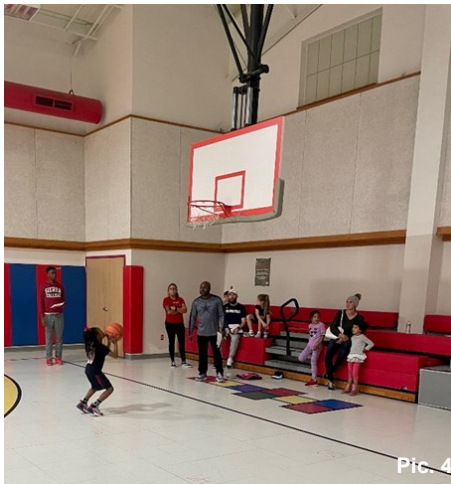
