Public Works

Water Distribution: Crews worked on repairing a water break on the 3700 block of Silver Street and 1500 King Street.

Engineering Division:

Stanford Street: The franchise utilities are moving poles and gas lines in the area from Houston Street to Pine Street.

Walnut Street: The contractor is placing concrete on the western lane from Family Dollar to Eutopia Street and placing the 6' x 3' storm line just north of Henry Street.

Traders Road Guardrail: Repairs started the week of November 30 and are expected to be completed the same week.

Wilton Drive: The contractor is removing old concrete sections and replacing them with flex base materials for asphalt operations to continue next week.

Roy Warren Sewer Project: The bore pit was completed, and the dry bore starts on November 30.

Roy Warren Roadway Project: The contractor has been placing new fencing in the right-of-way and started excavating trees and organic material for the project.

Pickett Street: The contractor is working on replacing the intersection at Pickett Street and Williams.

Wastewater Collection: Crews installed a new city-side clean out on the 4000 block of Fourth Street and replaced a sewer service to the main on the 2300 block of Stanford Street.

Street Division: The Street Department completed several pothole repairs in various locations, mowed Hallmark Street from FM 1570 to Coyote Crossing, and cleaned storm drain lines in the downtown area.

Utility Construction: Crews completed the new water line installment on the 2200 block of Gordon Street.
